

## Sonesta Amirat Dahabiya

7 nights / 8 days  
Aswan – Luxor Trip

### **Saturday**

- Embarkation in Aswan for a relaxing week sailing the Nile on a Luxuriously appointed Dahabeya
- **Overnight, the ship moors on the Nile Banks of Aswan**

### **Sunday**

- Today you will **visit the Aswan High Dam** (completed in 1971); **the Old Dam** (completed in 1902)
- You will also **visit the Philae Temple**, dedicated to the goddess Isis, a structure rescued from the rising waters of Lake Nasser at the time of the High Dam's construction
- Sail on the way to Kom Ombo (noon time)
- **Overnight near by Kom Ombo**

### **Monday**

- Morning sail to Kom Ombo
- To **visit the ptolemaic temple** dedicated to the crocodile god Sobek and the falcon-headed Horus, god of the morning sun
- **Overnight moored beside a Nile Island**

### **Tuesday**

- This morning you will sail to Edfu
- To **visit the wonderfully preserved Temple of Edfu**
- **Overnight moored beside an Island**

### **Wednesday**

- Today will be a leisurely day; After Breakfast
- Commence sailing to Esna, and passing the lock,
- **Then Dahabeya will moor beside a Nile Island**

### **Thursday**

- This morning you will sail to Luxor and **visit the magnificent temple complex of Amon-Ra at Karnak**, with its vast hypostyle hall of 137 columns, followed by the imposing 28th Dynasty Luxor Temple.

- **Overnight moored in Luxor**

**Friday**

- Excursion to the West Bank to **visit the great burial places of the Pharaohs - the Valley of the Kings** - where Howard Carter discovered the tomb of Tutankhamen in 1922. Continue to the adjacent **Valley of the Queens, Medinet Habu Temple and the Colossi of Memnon.**
- **Overnight moored in Luxor**

**Saturday**

- Breakfast aboard the Dehabeya
- **Followed by disembarkation**
